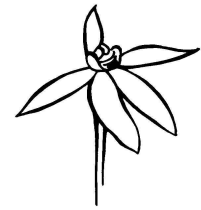

It has been a busy period since the last bulletin. We have had two Horticultural Society of Canberra shows, a weekend demonstration/display at Floriade and, of course, our own Spring Show.

In spite of an error of omission by the Bulletin Editor, there was a good display at the September Hort Show and thank you to those who brought in plants. Hopefully, we will have a good display at the October show. From my experience, the orchid table is a big hit at these shows and gives us another opportunity to show off our plants and have them judged.

I want to thank Bob Bush and Bill Ferris who put together the Floriade display and who spent the two lunch times demonstrating and talking about orchids. The demonstration area this year was not as well set out as last but still a number of people walked through, saw the orchids and listened to the demonstrations. In the Canberra Times, a young girl was interviewed and asked what she liked best about Floriade and almost at the top of her list were the orchids. Well done Bill and Bob.

The Show was as usual a great success even though there were fewer plants this year. I want to thank all those who helped out, and there were many of you, but particularly I want to thank Robyn Noel who managed so much of the show, and Mark Fraser and Jane Wright, who were the Marshals, and in a very short space

of time had all the plant organized. Audrey and Robert Rough yet again organized and delivered the food, which was a major appeal for many and was certainly a life saver for those working at the show. We had about 700 visitors through in the two days. On Sunday, a bus load of Sydney orchid enthusiasts arrived for a morning cuppa and a look at the show. They had been to Floriade the previous day and seemed to enjoy the orchids and in particular the morning tea and scones that Audrey provided. Trevor Hughes brought up a truck load of cymbidiums that all sold over the weekend and the other vendors did well also. Thanks to Jane Wright and all the others who managed the sales table. Saturday, when the show opened there certainly was a feeding frenzy, but the line moved well and most people seemed happy. We were very proud to have two plants recommended for awards, one cattleya (Geof Dyne) and one native (Jenny and Theo Schutz) so the quality of plants was high. Well done to all those who brought plants and all those who helped run the show.

The Christmas meeting will be held at the Seventh Day Adventist Church this year. Remember to bring a plate to share as well as your plants. We will provide soft drinks and juice as in past years. Rob Rough and Jane Wright will provide the quizzes and there will be plants for people to win. I hope to see you all there.

Guest speaker:

Tonight we had Mark Clements speaking on the orchids of Malaysia. He travelled on 'A Malaysian Singapore Orchid Tour' organised by the Shergolds from 'Easy Orchids'.

It was a great talk accompanied by many beautiful pictures of orchids and the countryside of Malaysia and Singapore. This was a tour with a packed schedule from orchid shows, to market stalls, to wild mountain forests, to botanic gardens, with orchids dripping from every place. Some of the highlights included photos of *Paphiopedilum rothschildianum*, shots from Mount Kinabalu and absolutely stunning displays in the Singapore Botanic Gardens. The tour included a visit to a flowering *Rhaphesia* in Borneo. This parasitic plant is famous for having the largest flower in the world. They

often occur on private land and the flower takes about 9 – 15 months to develop. The National Parks authorities are alerted when the flower is about to open and they in turn notify the tour groups. Flowering will last for about 7 days and the highest prices to visit are paid for the first few days. The money is split among the involved parties. Almost everything was for sale regarding the orchids, including some very rare dendrobiums. Also for sale were many legally collected orchids (windfall) but a 3 week ban on export was the cause of much frustration! It was sad to see the evidence of illegal logging. This is a trade that is very difficult to police unfortunately, and an economic necessity for many.

It was an inspiring talk and photo show. It's always great to have an expert show us around the rest of the orchid world.

- The recent Horticulture Show had a good table of orchids. The next of the Horticulture shows is on October 27th and 28th and will again have a table reserved for our orchids.
- Our Spring Show was very successful with over 700 visitors, including a busload from the Campbelltown Cymbidium Society. A big thanks to the main organizers Robyn Noel, Jane Wright, Mark Fraser, and Rob and Audrey Rough for their work in running the kitchen.
- Thanks also to all who participated by bringing along their orchids and entering their art and craftwork, including Meryl Limbrecht, who posted up a beautiful collage for entry in the show all the way from her home in Wahgunyah.
- The weekend following the show was the Sapphire Coast show attended by Sandra, Mark, Robyn and Jane who took some of the spring show orchids with them to make a display.
- Our workshop was advertised in 'Orchids Australia' and we have already one booking.

Guest speaker:

Tonight Scott Mann spoke on orchids of the Philippines (it was originally to be the orchids of China, but Scott has promised this for another night).

Scott has spent quite a bit of time in the Philippines as his wife has family living there.

We were treated to a beautiful slide show showing the orchids of the Philippines, with environments ranging

from tropical lowlands, to misty mountains, to the harsh 50m high ash face of Mount Piñata Bo – this in particular was amazing to see. The mountain/volcano had blown its top in 1991 leaving a large, sheer 50m wall of deposited volcanic ash, but now its top is covered with lush grasses, bamboos and ferns, with orchids mixed in. On the wall face Scott had taken photos of Bulbophyllum, which from the growth he guessed had been there at least 6 years. He had photos also of Banane; the 1500m of UNESCO listed rice terraces that are about 2,000 years old. The Philippines is so rich with orchids, growing as weeds in the rice terraces and dripping from trees in the city streets. We saw photos of Spathoglottis in all colours including yellow, Dendrobiums, Bulbophyllum, Epidendrum, Vanda, Oncidium, Brassavola, Cymbidium, Phalaenopsis, and Paphiopedilum, just to name a few. Photos of the local orchids shows showed orchids of the highest of high standards. Even the photos of orchids growing in private gardens were amazing! It was a fabulous tour of the country and we certainly look forward to seeing Scott's photos of the orchids of China.

South and West Regional Show Bega 2007:

Jane gave us a run down and a look at some photos of this show, which this year was hosted by the Sapphire Coast Orchid Society. Seven societies displayed (Albury –Wodonga, Wagga Wagga, Shoalhaven, Bateman's Bay, Sapphire Coast and Canberra). Albury – Wodonga won the first place for the displays and ours came in third. The tree was the display, as was seen at our Spring Show, along with the theme of a tribute to collectors of the past, represented by old overflowing chests and plant presses. Thanks were given to those who donated their plants for the display, and many of these won prizes. Jane had a photo of the champion species of the show, which was an impressive Cymbidium lowianum. The transport of this pendulous orchid was impressive on its own! Another request was made for plants for the coming Cronulla show.

Australasian Orchid Show:

Nita announced that, along with a swag of prizes and certificates for orchids brought by her and Mark Clements to this show, Mark won the Grand Champion. A request has been made to submit a photo for the prestigious Bill Murdoch Trophy.

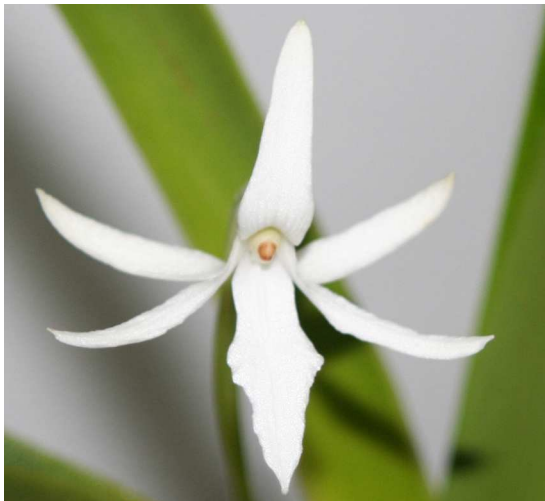
