

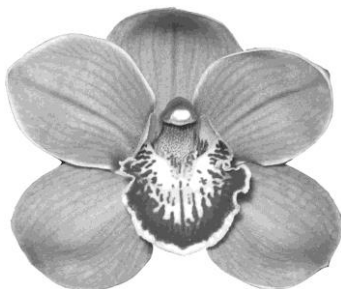

### **FLORAL ART – PART 3**

1. Eligibility of entries refer to rule 1.1 (Conditions of Entry).
2. Flowers other than orchids may be used, orchids are to predominate. Any other embellishment is allowed.
3. Novice shall mean any member who has not previously won a Championship in any Floral Art Competition.
4. Exhibitors intending to compete in the Floral Art must notify the Show Marshall on the **Monday prior to the show**

## **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - PART 1**

1. All entries are free and open to members of Sapphire Coast Orchid Club & members of O.S.N.S.W. and Affiliated Societies.
2. All entries shall be in show condition and free from pests and disease.
3. All entries shall be made on the official entry form available from the Secretary.
4. All exhibits and all exhibitors shall conform to the rules and by-laws of the O.S.N.S.W. and the Judges decision shall be final.
5. Plants competing for prizes must have been owned and in the possession of the exhibitor for a minimum period of six months, this does not apply to foliage plants used in displays and floral art.
6. The Show Marshal and committee reserve the right to reject, remove and rearrange any exhibit without giving any reason for doing so, and to reclassify any plant if necessary, prior to Judging.
7. Entries shall be received on the basis that the Club shall take all reasonable care of the exhibits, and the exhibitor shall have no claim against the Club.
8. Each exhibitor shall be responsible for the correct labelling of his/her plants.
9. An exhibitor may not remove any exhibit before the termination of the show without permission of the Show Marshal.
10. All plants are eligible for prizes. First and Second points shall be awarded in each class. If, in the opinion of the judges, no exhibit in any class warrants a prize, none shall be given.
11. Further prizes may be given at the discretion of the committee, and, or Judges.
12. All entries shall be in the hands of the Show Marshal and placed in position ready for judging by **4.30pm on the day preceding the opening of the show.**
13. The Show Marshall may exercise discretion regarding the acceptance of late entries.
14. The Club reserves the exclusive right to photograph any exhibit.
15. The AOC Trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor with the highest overall point score at the Winter show and the Maurine Cochrane Trophy at the Spring Show.
16. The Phil Grech Cymbidium Seedling medal will be awarded to the Champion Cymbidium Seedling at the winter show. In the event that this championship is not awarded at the winter show, the Champion Cymbidium Seedling at the spring show will receive the medal.

## **DEFINITIONS - PART 2**

1. Seedling shall mean the complete plant grown from seed and flowered for the first time and includes both species as well as hybrids. Plants that have been grown on or divided prior to being exhibited on the show bench are not eligible to be shown as Seedlings. For exhibition, Seedlings shall retain their status of Seedling throughout the flowering season in which they flower.
2. Cymbidium classes 17-24 are those where the majority of the flowers are less than 60mm. Cymbidium class 9-16 are those where most of the flowers exceed 60mm, and are not more than 90mm.
3. Specimen refers to a mature plant exhibiting multiple growths and multiple racemes of flowers.
4. Novice. Shall mean any exhibitor until he/she has won the Novice Championship at any Orchid Show or Shows. The exhibitor shall remain a novice until the end of the calendar year in which they win the Novice Championship. The novice exhibitor may not be promoted to the 'Open' section if the Committee considers the competition in which the championship was won of insufficient strength to warrant promotion or if the committee considers the experience and confidence of the exhibitor in competition is insufficient to warrant promotion.
5. Junior shall mean any member of the SCOC, under the age of 16 (sixteen) years of age.
6. For the purpose of this show conventional nomenclature will be used and exhibitors are asked to enter their plants in the appropriate class.
